She was a committed volunteer and will be sadly missed by her colleagues and those volunteers and members with whom she came in contact.

Shirley joined 1RPH in 1987 and in 34 years of service contributed much to the development of the station as it is today. Knowledgeable, widely read and travelled, she achieved an enviable reputation for RPH programming. Utilising her association with blindness organisations in America and local community focus groups she established the Community Round Up program. Her choice of books suitable for broadcasting was a notable feature with her role as program director.
